



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR DIVORCING PARENTS

ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND THE CHILD IMPACT PROGRAM

Alternative Dispute Resolution focuses on ways individuals going through divorce can resolve conflicts outside of the courtroom. The Child Impact Program provides information to help parents better understand the impact of divorce or custody changes on their children. The program teaches skills that will enable parents to make choices and decisions that will be consistent with their emotional and developmental needs.

PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The program is presented in two, two-hour sessions or as one, four-hour session. The program is led by a pair of counselors –one male and one female –for classes of up to 25 participants. There is one brief break during each two-hour portion.

Alternative Dispute Resolution content is presented at the beginning of the program and lasts approximately twenty minutes. The remaining time will focus on the Child Impact Program information.

Things to Keep in Mind:

- Children are not allowed to attend the class.
- Couples involved in serious conflict should attend separate classes.
- Classes begin on time and participants should log in 10 minutes early. Late arrivals may be accepted due to trouble joining the meeting up to 15 minutes after start of class.
- Fees are non-refundable.
- Upon completion of four hours of class time, you will receive a Certificate of Attendance.
- Courts will be notified of successful Child Impact Program completion.
